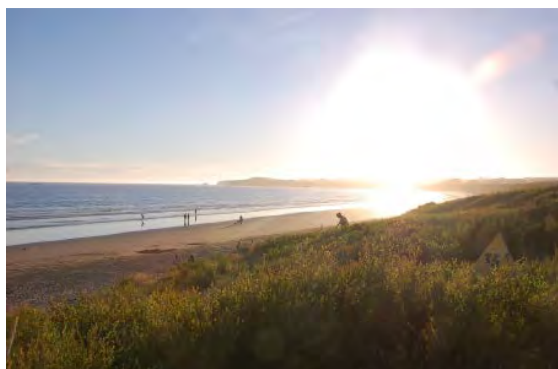

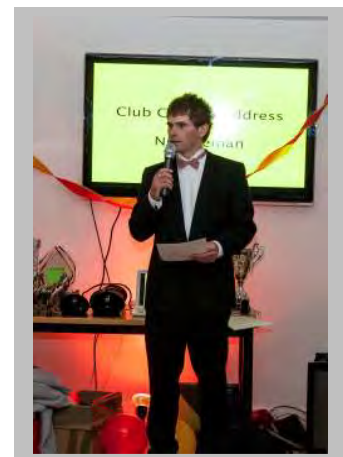

Congratulations to Tim Evans and Tom Bundy McMorrow who obtained employment as professional lifeguards for the first time this summer. Those boys certainly lived the dream. We also maintained our high standards of vigilance and service and kept the beaches safe over the guard summer!

The team managed two suspected spinal incidents, a near resuscitation and multiple rescues. Luke Foster performed a dramatic rescue of a young boogie boarder at Tidal River. With conditions throwing up big swell and 30km winds the young boy drifted perilously close the rocks at the mouth of tidal river. Fozzy took out a rescue board but had to paddle the boy up onto a rock to avoid the large waves crashing into the rocks. Well done Fozzy on a very brave rescue!

Our rookie guards Tom McMorrow and Tim Evans have certainly learnt some great lessons already about how much of a step up professional lifeguarding is compared to volunteer patrol.

Well done Sam on a great year. I am really proud of your efforts this year. You are an extremely valued member of our club. We are lucky to have such a quality person and leader like you around 😊



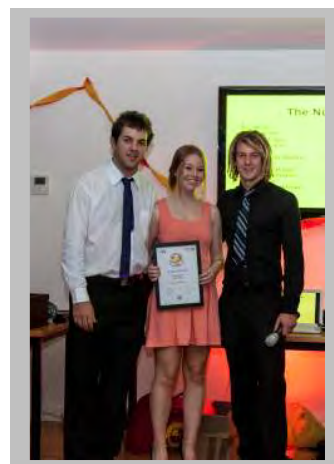

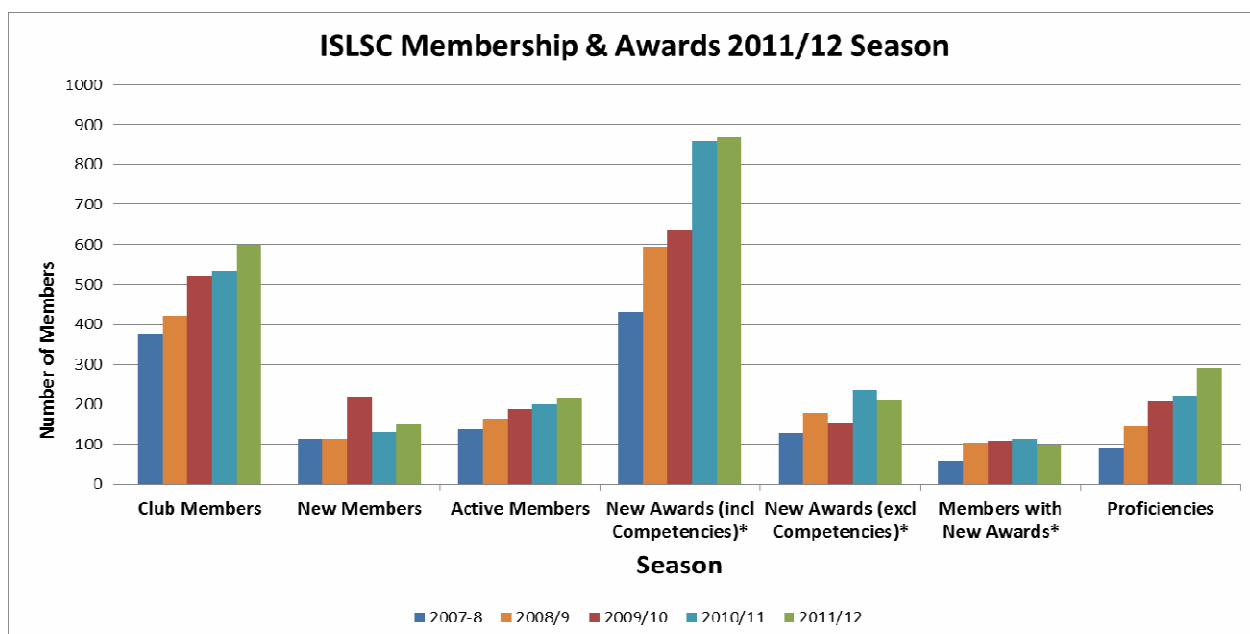

ISLSC Chief Instructors' Report - Season 2011/12

The 2011/12 season has been another strong season for Training. It was the first full season of training in our own clubhouse. For the Bronze camps in particular this was a significant step forward and a wonderful experience for trainers and candidates alike.

From a performance perspective, total lifesaving awards gained were down 13% year on year. This was primarily due to fewer candidates participating in the Luther camp, Summer SRC and ARTC training. Despite this, long term trend continues to be positive. This decrease was offset by a 24% increase in the number of Proficiencies reflecting our strength in member retention.

Membership growth was strong with an increase of 11% year on year with total membership reaching 600 for the first time. This was matched by an 11% increase in the number of new members and continued growth (6%) of our Active membership which supported an increase in the number of Patrol Teams.



I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge some of the standout awards and achievements for the season:

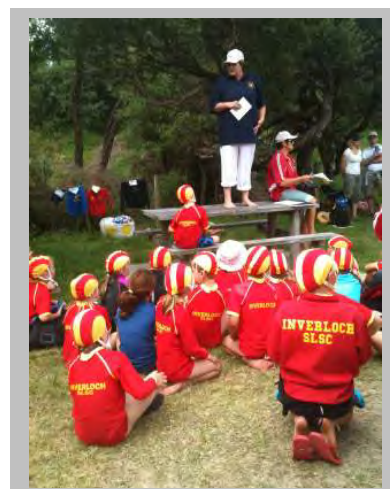
Inverloch SLSC Junior Report

In 2010/2011 Inverloch hosted the Eastern Regional Carnival where approx 100 of our Nippers qualified to compete at the Victorian State Titles. Only 9 of them ended up going to Lakes Entrance and competing. They had a fantastic time and decided that they should do it again the following season.

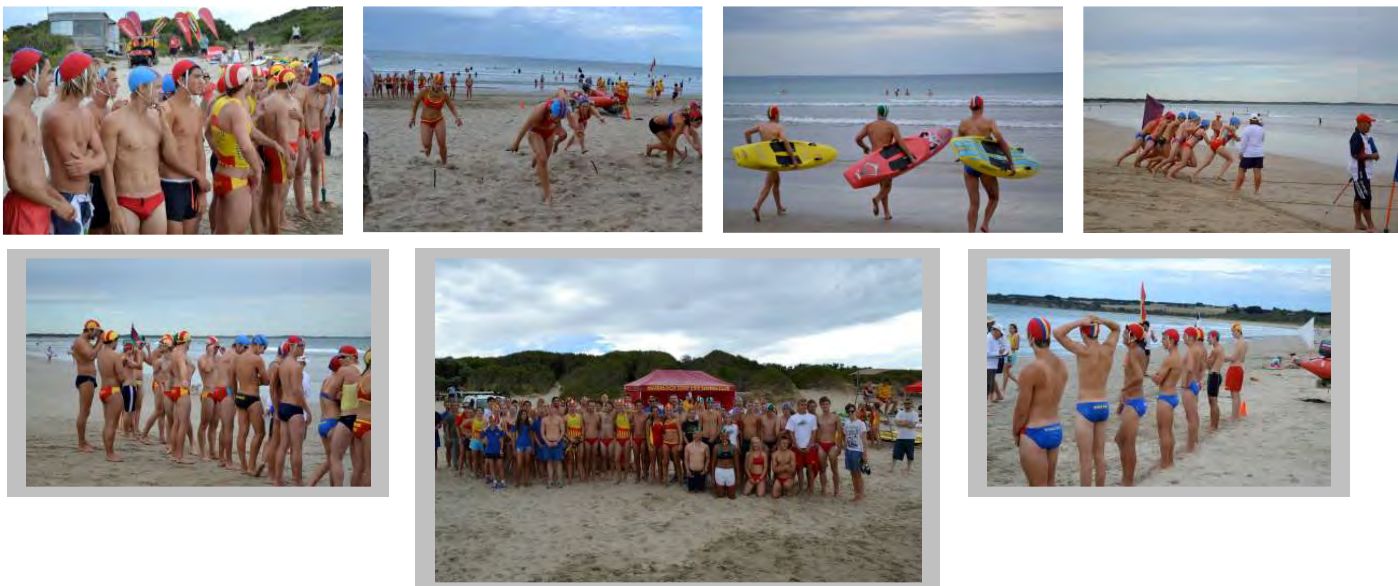

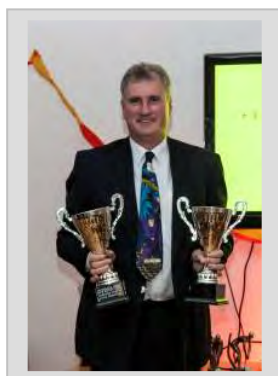

Inverloch SLSC 2011/12 Season Surfboat Report

The Inverloch SLSC Surfboat Team was established in January 2011 with the donation of a surfboat and a team of Masters Women keen to start this new sport in the club. The 2011/12 financial year has seen many advancements in developing this new competition stream within the club, including –



- **Team** – Establishing a Womens Masters Team, currently with seven rowers – Michelle Roberts, Nicole Hassall, Fiona Hughes, Kirsty Evans, Rosie Markesich, Sarah-Jane Mead & Jane Edney. The team has developed their flat water rowing skills, showing real commitment and perserverance with both on & off boat training. The team has rowed together weekly during 2011 and Summer & Autum 2012, they are currently taking a winter break to resume in August 2012 in preparation for next season.
- **Key Challenge** - The teams biggest challenge has been to find an experienced sweep to train them and sweep in the surf. Trevor Clauscens (Woolamai) and Dave Ferguson (Mornington) have generously helped with training and Geoff Allum joined the team on 29/5/11 and has commenced training as an Inverloch sweep. The challenge continues to be getting proficient as sweep & rowers in the surf and the team will continue to need assistance outside the club for at least the next season.
- **Competition** – The team competed and performed well in two competitions last season, the Cerberus Marathon in October 2011 and the Lakes Entrance Marathon in February 2012. Competitions in the surf were unfortunately not possible due to the lack of an experienced sweep.
- **Conclusion of Memorandum of Understanding** – This agreement was concluded in January 2012 and the surfboat team is now fully included in the clubs normal operations.
- **Mornington Surfboat donation** – Mornington SLSC kindly donated a fully-tubbed fibreglass surfboat & trailer in November 2011, which was much needed as the existing Lakes boat did not meet the specification needed for surf rowing competition.
- **Sponsorship** – The surfboat team successfully sourced a generous sponsor to help fund it for the next 3 years.

Finance Report – Season 2011/2012

Inverloch S.L.S.C. passed the 600 member mark this season but we're only a small club. We have an IRB Racing Team, Summer Comp team, Surfboat Team and Nippers Comp Team but we are only a small club. We have a \$1.5 million clubhouse but we're only a small club and our turnover almost hit the quarter of a million dollars – We are no longer just a small club!!!

For those who remember the 'getting started' phase 13 years ago and the 'Shipping Container' phase, we were that small club that welcomes anyone and everyone and I hope this is one part of the club that we never outgrow. The rest is up to history to determine!

My first year as Treasurer has been interesting to say the least. I wondered where will the money come from to run the club, how do we fund Patrols, manage the clubhouse and still have time to promote the Nippers, Competition Teams and do the million other things that make the wheels turn???

Some 12 months later I'm not sure that I have all the answers but we have done everything that was on the list....

Now I could bore you with stat's about the 647 cheques we wrote and the 283 EFT's we made not to mention the 459 deposits that went into our accounts in the last 12 months but that's just book work and doesn't give you the real picture. As much as any Lifesaving Club likes to think of themselves as just a club the reality is that we are now what many would consider to be a "small business". We may be a Not-for-Profit but none the less a business that needs to be run like any other. We have customers both internal (our members) and external (the public) that rely on the club in different ways. We have suppliers who provide things that we need (for a price) and they need to be paid. We have sponsors, who through their generosity, allow us to grow and continue providing the service that makes us who we are....

Make no mistake each group is no more or no less important than any other and by working together in a spirit of mutual cooperation the Inverloch S.L.S.C. will continue to exist, to grow and to prosper.

Let's take the book work out of the discussion and see what some of the highlights were for the last 12 months!! Thanks to the RACV Resort we now "own" our clubhouse. Their generosity allowed us to pay out the loan years ahead of schedule. The kiosk has proven to be our little 'cash cow' contributing some \$20,000 to our bank account. We would be crazy to lease it out to anyone else but we also need more volunteers to

get behind the counter and help the dedicated few who made it the success that is it!!

The Board has started phase one of the Asset Replacement Program. All the gear we have used over the last 13 years, as we saved for a clubhouse, has been pushed past its use by date! The A.R.P. seeks to replace this Plant & Equipment that makes us the Lifesaving Service that we are. We have seen the first acquisitions this season with the new Beach Trolley for the IRB's replacing the original Copley trailer and the Polaris ATV taking the load off the Surf Truck. The Hard Hull IRB, new radios, patrol flags, Competition Board Trailer just to name a few other things. In fact through grants, donations, sponsors contributions and our own efforts we added over \$80,000 of assets to the club this year. Not bad for 'just a small club'!

We have hosted a Senior Summer Carnival, an IRB Carnival and IRB State Titles in the last 12 months and given our club a reputation, as the L.S.V. guys say, for "putting on a good show"!!

Thanks to the hard work of our members and volunteers we even managed to run these events profitably and that always makes the Treasurer smile! ☺

I am enormously proud of the Competition Teams in our club. They have had to raise their own funds in order to compete and they have done so with fantastic results. The Summer Team managed to buy 3 new Comp Boards, the IRB Team is waiting on delivery of their new racing boat and the Surf Boat Team are looking as sharp as, in their newly refurbished boat! They all set their goals, worked towards them and achieved what they set out to do – a fantastic effort and a huge well done to all concerned!!

But like most Treasurers there are times when I don't always smile: Here's some of the scary stuff that puts it all into perspective. It costs just over \$20,000 to put the Patrols on the beach each season. Gas, electricity and phone costs fade in comparison to insurance costs for the clubhouse, equipment, rego for the truck and ATV. Every time a tap gets broken in a shower or a hose fitting gets run over a replacement is purchased and we become a little poorer that day! Every time a board gets damaged, every time we need to fix a clothes line out the back, every time we get a motor serviced so you can play in the IRB's each summer on patrol, the club becomes a little poorer....

It is a never ending cycle but one I am happy to say we are winning at the moment. For those financially astute people you may be able to make one simple observation from the financials in the Annual Report.

Financials

The operations of the club itself, manages to keep its head above water, which is a good thing for a club to do. This bulk of this year's profit (and cash in the bank) however came from the generosity of our sponsors. Without them we would be doubling the clothing prices, tripling the Membership fees and renting the clubhouse out to other groups in peak season to keep the \$\$ coming in!!

Overall - We are in a good position financially but we have no room for complacency. Each of us has a part to play in making sure that we don't just survive but continue to grow and prosper for decades to come.

The Board will do its part managing the club the best it can. We will look to sponsors (new and old) and find new ways to keep the money coming in. We will ask our members to step up when needed to help keep the costs down. I will keep telling you to "turn the lights off" and "shut the doors" when the air-con is on. You will do your part by looking after your clubhouse, looking after the equipment and looking after each other.

My goal for the next 12 months is very simple. To be able to write this report and repeat myself – "We are in a good position financially but we have no room for complacency." If I can say that next year then everyone will have done their bit for their club!!

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 31 May 2012

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(b) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(c) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(d) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

(f) Investments

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.
