I am pleased to report that season 2013-14 has been one of continued growth, consolidation and success in all areas. A big thanks to all our members who have contributed to the success of the Inverloch Surf Life Saving Club.

Season 2013-14 was a long season and we faced exceptional changes to the way we operate with the loss of the patrol tower, bad weather during Nippers and limited beach access due to challenging beach conditions. Everyone is to be commended for making the best of what we had and still delivering excellent patrol services from December to April and a fantastic Nipper program for nearly 200 excited juniors.

Our clubhouse continues to be a social hub for our patrollers and other members. I am pleased to report that patrols continue to have their after patrol social functions and this is a huge attraction for newer members to meet other members and feel welcome to our club. Lifesaving membership is year round and it is pleasing to see members continuing to improve their skills and teams training throughout the colder months. Importantly various community groups use the facility to hold meetings and training sessions throughout the year. Many thanks to David Schultz, Andy Schrape and Alan Bolton for their ongoing work in maintaining the clubhouse to a high standard.

Our membership sits at 678 members with 180 of these actively patrolling the beach. We are the envy of many other clubs in the state with our strong patrolling list. This is a reflection of the hard work and commitment by Tarryn Thom, Club Captain and Bec Morris, Patrol Manager and their Patrol Captains and ISR teams. Nippers continues to be very popular with an all-time record of 194 Nippers, many of whom go on to gain qualifications and patrol the beach.

Opportunities exist in many areas for members to be involved. From bronze camps, Nipper programs and competition, YIP's program, summer and winter (IRB) competition teams and the surfboat team. The avenues to be involved in our club continue to grow and have success. Many thanks to the coaches, leaders, officials and managers who give up their time to run these and encourage others to be involved.

Our members make the most of the leadership development opportunities available at a state and national level. It is very pleasing to see Inverloch represented at the various camps and programs and hear the positive feedback concerning our members. 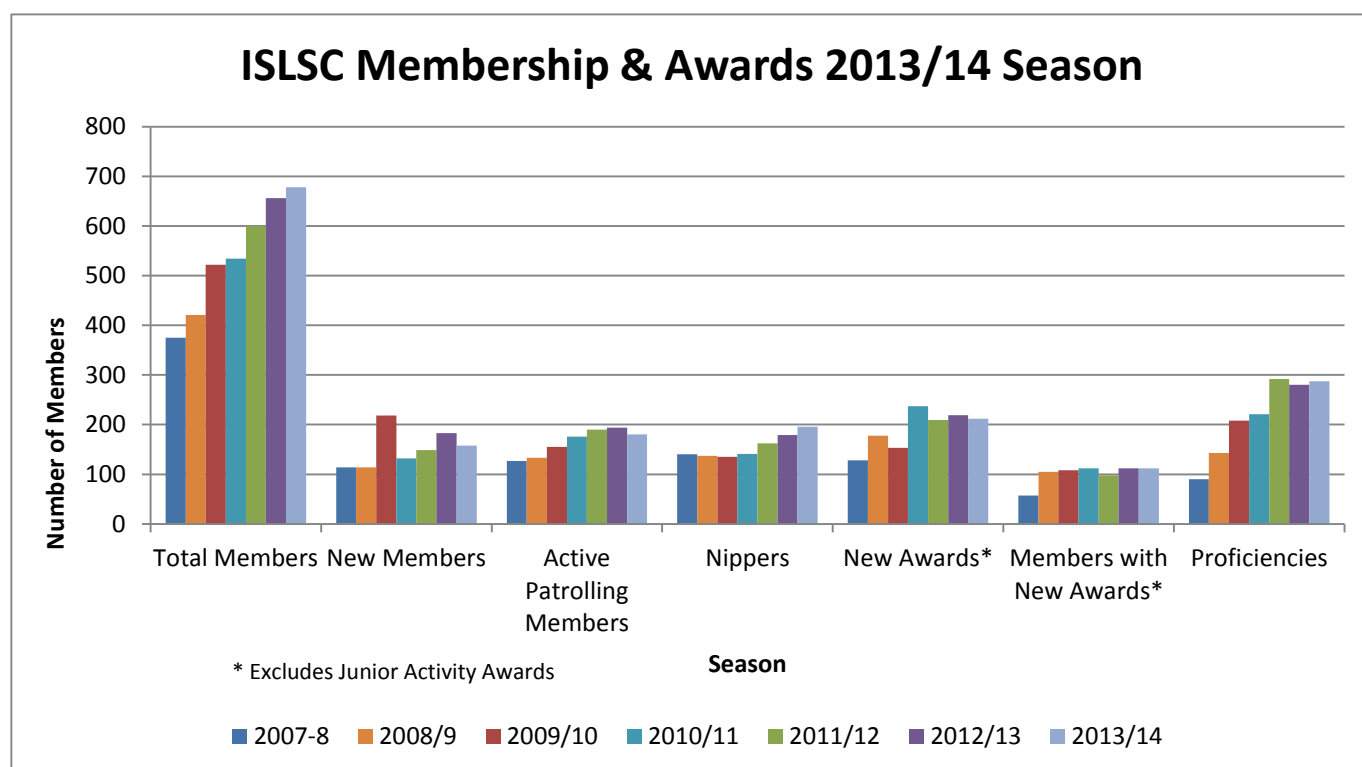

Membership

Membership Report

For the seventh year in a row total club membership has increased. This season we achieved 678 members up 3% on 2012/13. New member intake decreased by 14% but retention of previous members increased to offset this reduction with two particular areas of note; Nipper retention increased 8% and Active Patrolling members increased by 17%. This is particularly pleasing as retention of active patrollers enables us to deliver core lifesaving services.

This season Nipper numbers were up to a record 194, thanks to the Nipper team and volunteer helpers for all their hard work to enable us to increase the available places. Bronze Camp enrolments were also up for both Kew High School and Luther College which resulted in a record number of 65 new Bronze Medallion awards. Thanks to Hilary and the training team for making this possible.



Gender balance of the club remains a strength with a 51/49% split of female/male participation. Balance is consistent on all age groups except Cadets where more work is required to encourage male participation rates.

Female representation on the Board (63%) increased significantly this season with 3 new female board members taking up key positions this season. Our challenge is to ensure we retain this strong female representation on the board into the future.

Membership

Local membership (Inverloch & surrounds) represents 26% of total membership. Local membership has reduced by 4% following small increases over the last two seasons (2.5%) reflecting the significant holiday maker participation in Nippers and the Bronze intake from Melbourne based schools.

Senior Summer Competition Team Report

The 2013/14 season was again another successful one for our team. We achieved many great results on the beach and in the water; we also continued to develop our team culture and morale.

Again, we started the season with our pre season training camp. The weekend was run by elite coaches and competitors who took fitness and technique sessions, these sessions were very valuable in improving and critiquing the skills of our athletes. The training camp was a great motivator for the members of the team as they begin to focus on the upcoming carnivals. On behalf of the team I would like to thank those coaches who made the camp a successful one.

The team competed at all 6 Summer Surf Series carnivals; this is a testament to the commitment and desire of the team. There were many highlights over the six carnivals, too many to mention, but a couple which could not be ignored.

Mens 2km run - We have always been strong in the event, winning pennants and medals in previous seasons. This season we dominated; winning all six pennants across the six carnivals. Nick Leman, Luke Foster, Tom McMorrow and Sam Cresswell lead the dominance, all winning pennants.

This season also saw the emergence of a beach superstar. Corrie Argus-Smith showed what he is capable of by becoming one of the best flaggers and sprinters in the state for his U17 age group. Corrie won 4 pennants throughout the Season, including two in one Carnival. Being selected in the Victorian High Performance squad topped off Corrie's stellar season. It was a huge season by the team, congratulations to everyone who competed at the Carnivals, you should all be very proud of your efforts.

The Victorian State Championships is the pinnacle event in Victorian Lifesaving. This year we took a very strong team, with everyone putting in hours of training so they could be at their best for this major event. This reflected in our results over the weekend. We won a total of 5 medals, the highest in the club's history. The 2km run

The third year of the Inverloch SLSC Surfboat Team saw the continued development of the Masters Women team.

- **Season goals** were set & largely met! Our goals were -
 - Develop sweep skills sufficient to compete in surfboat competitions
 - Develop surf rowing skills in existing & new rowers sufficient to compete
 - Compete at rowing carnivals in manageable conditions
 - Have sufficient 'fit' qualified rowers to train & compete
 - Train together weekly in the boat (80% individual attendance goal)
 - Encourage new rowers & teams from within the club.
- **Team** – Five rowers and sweep (Geoff Allum) are still involved. Rowers are Michelle Roberts, Nicole Hassall, Fiona Hughes, Sarah-Jane Mead, Tania Cumming (who has dual membership with Venus Bay & Inverloch)

The physical demands of the sport have not been kind on some of our rowers and we have lost 2 rowers permanently due to injury, Rosie Markesich & Jane Edney.



Retaining the same core of rowers & sweep demonstrates significant commitment as the team has continued to travel to Inverloch to row most Sundays throughout the whole year and train independently at home.

- **Encouraging new teams** – we have continued to try to encourage new rowers and teams within our club membership. The commitment involved to train for surfboat rowing is very high and to date, despite our best efforts, no new teams have committed to continue beyond attending a few sessions. Having said this we have two potential rowers wishing to join training again, after having trained with us a few times last year.
- **Training** – the surfboat team have continued to row most Sundays at Inverloch throughout the year with an 80% individual participation goal for each team member. Being down to 5 rowers has made it more difficult to field a crew every week this year.
- **Competition** – The Masters Women's team competed in the Open Womens Division at Point Leo over the summer and were very pleased with our performance. We were keen to compete at the Masters Championship at Lorne, but found we were ineligible to compete a couple of days prior to the Championships, which was very disappointing.

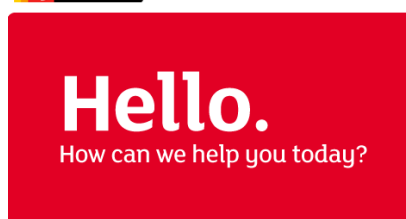

Financials

Finance Report

At the end of last year's financial report I wrote –

“We cannot afford to be complacent!!”

Season 2013/2014 was a bit of a tough year in many ways not the least of which was financially.

We didn't get the lion's share of the Grants and donations like we did last year.

EG: Grants/Donations - 2012/13 - \$131K vs 2013/14 - \$10k

We cannot afford to be complacent!!

Weather extremes kept Kiosk sales subdued resulting in a 13.5% fall in profit or in dollar terms nearly \$3,000. That's 2 Comp Boards, 8 Nipper Boards, an IRB motor or a set of digital radios!! This type of result echoed through the whole of the financial year with Trading Profit dropping from \$146k last year to just \$45k this year. (Before depreciation) Turnover set a new record last year of \$289k only to drop this year to the \$166k mark.

We cannot afford to be complacent!!

Major sponsors have mostly finished their term and those still going are well and truly in the sunset phase.

We don't have a benefactor banging on the door wanting to throw a brown paper bag full of cash our way or even a rich relative with a dodgy heart...

We cannot afford to be complacent!!

But it wasn't all doom and gloom - on the other side of the coin good management by the Board, hard work by the usual members and some incredibly generous people coming to our aid have ensured that we have not suffered as much as we could have from the financial downturn. This showed in our expenses which dropped from \$146K in 2012/2013 to \$122K in 2013/2014 and that is a very good result overall. Remember that most of last year's income was used in the Asset Replacement Program, so income has fallen a lot further than expenses...

Our family friendly ethos increased family membership revenue this season by \$10k as we flew past the 600 member mark. This year was our biggest Nipper season yet again, surpassing last year, as we came in just under 200 Nippers, which is nothing short of sensational. Maybe next season we'll break that 200 mark if enough people put their hands up to help??

Last year saw our utilities cost, specifically electricity, spiral out of control. Just before Christmas we converted our electric hot water over to gas thanks to the very generous assistance of **Greg Ellis from Rinnai Australia Ltd**. Thank you doesn't even begin to express our appreciation Greg!!

Financials

Members Please Note that this **does not** give you permission to have longer showers as we aim to save some money to buy boards, ski's and other vital equipment that the club can always use....got it??

As stated earlier last year's lucrative Grant funding was used to replace the tired and outdated Lifesaving assets that had been pushed well past their 'use by dates' as we saved for a clubhouse. We now have a garage full of new, up to date gear, vehicles, boats and training items that will see us well through this decade before we need to start updating them again.....

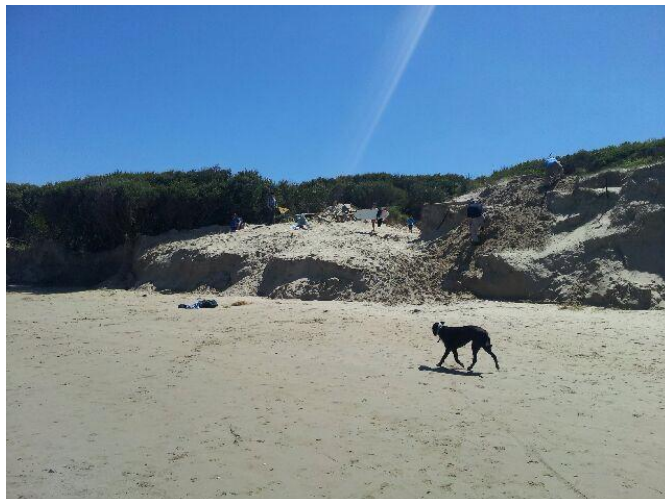
As I write this report **Matt Spinks** of - **The One Stop Shop Australia and The Tint Professor** fame and his crew are putting the finishing touches to the reorganising of our garage and rear alley way storage. The Board had slated this work to be done over winter but Matt and his crew stepped in and did in days what would have taken us weeks or months to complete. His work ethic was only exceeded by his generosity in donating the materials and labour. We must thank him sincerely for such a fantastic gesture. If you haven't seen it already, the garage and alley is a sight to behold. Neat, tidy, a place for everything and everything in its place!! ***Let's keep it that way!!***

As much as this all sounds wonderful for the future – *We cannot afford to be complacent!!* Remember the long walk over the track, past the Tower, down the long stretch of sand to finally get onto the beach???

Amazing how much things can change in just over a year. No stretch of sand, no long walk, just a bit of a drop to the beach and most importantly – **NO TOWER** anymore!!



Now for all those softies who have never patrolled from the beach before, well this is how we did it back in the old days, you know before mobile phones, PlayStations and the electricity needed to run them!! ☺

As much as it was a good experience for many Patrollers to see what it was like at the coal face of Lifesaving I have to agree with them on one point. The Tower does have a multitude of advantages over standing on the beach in the wind all weekend, especially when the tide comes in, all the way up to the dunes....

So, the next big challenge is to replace the Tower....and that won't be easy!!

Early offers of financial assistance have dried up as Pre-Selection for upcoming State Elections draws closer, budgets get slashed and 'other priorities' apparently have to take precedence.

Some Invy locals have taken up the cause which is fantastic but they too have to survive and whilst we haven't lost hope of securing some assistance, going it alone for a new Tower could cost the club as much as \$100,000 once built and fitted out. That my fellow members is a big hit in anyone's terms!!

More than ever - We cannot afford to be complacent!!

We are fortunate enough to have that sort of cash available in our bank accounts (see Balance Sheet) and that has happened because of measured strategies from the Board. The down side is that if we have to use all our own money for a Tower it will make next season tougher, financially, than we have had in a long time. To assist this every member will be out shaking tins and I'm not just talking Patrollers either, I'm talking every member! We will have to BBQ enough Egg & Bacon Rolls, Sausages and Hamburgers to feed a small African nation and the Kiosk will have to sell enough cappuccino's to subsidise the 2016 Olympic Games in (Rio) Brazil.

Financials

A Lifesaving Club is an on-going concern, not just one season. No point having a sparkling new tower if we can't afford to put Patrols on the beach to use it!! The big picture still needs to be taken into consideration at all times. The Big Picture is so much more than just a season.....

So what lies ahead for us???

Rest assured that the Board is out there applying for Grants, hunting for funding, trying to ease the financial burden of replacing the Tower. In the meantime every member has to do their part to assist.

Therefore you will take a bit more care of the gear, you will shorten your showers, you will turn the lights off and the air cons too when you leave the clubhouse. Try not to drop the motors (again) and keep the board damage to a minimum. Every dollar we don't spend on repairs and things is two dollars saved!!

We cannot afford to be complacent!!

When the Board says 'NO' to something you want, you now know why and believe me 'NO' is a word that you will be hearing a lot more of over the next 12 months!!

Let's hope that the Lifesaving gods smile upon us.....Oh and if you happen to know someone who has a spare \$100k lying around doing nothing, give them my number please 😊

In next year's report I plan to write – *"We weren't complacent and we have come through a challenging time with flying colours!!"*

Help me make this happen!!!
