President's Report

It's certainly been a learning experience for myself and a number of new Committee members, having to come to terms with the realities of the mechanics of surf life saving for the very first time. However, with the help of experienced campaigners, together with their own persistence they have embraced their roles and responsibilities.

Membership

Our membership continues to grow, with around 350 members. This is a particularly good result given the difficulties the club faces without permanent, fully functional facilities. Our patrolling members comprise 67 (down from 70 last year). These members comprise 33 female and 34 male. It is pleasing to see that many of these members have come through the club's Nipper Program. Should we be able to maintain this trend, we can look forward to further growth in patrolling members as the Nipper Program goes from strength to strength.

Finance

The audited financial statement are attached and show that the club maintained a healthy financial position with a profit of around \$51,000 and nearly \$100,000 worth of equipment (fixed assets). \$65,906 is being held in Cash Assets (\$40,717 last year).

Sponsorships, grants and donations continue to be a key funding source for the club representing \$46,509 for the year.

Equipment

Equipment purchases were relatively minimal during the year, however, winter evaluations will be required and it is expected that a number of items will need to be replaced. This includes motors and rescue boards. The success of young member recruitment and continuing interest in competition will mean that further new items of equipment will be required. One notable addition to our asset inventory was the "shed". That is, a board and equipment trailer predominantly for use by the Nippers. The trailer was built from scratch by Bill Bramich (a Nipper grandfather) utilising a mix of donated and purchased materials. The "shed" is a sight to behold and will no doubt serve the club well for many years. Also thank you to Lease Plan for their sponsorship via insurance of the "shed".

In the meantime, the club would like to sincerely thank the Western Beach Caravan Park (Isabella and Ken McLean) for their continuing support in providing storage for some of our equipment and for providing accommodation for our patrolling members and hosting our bronze camp. The generosity and support of members, supporters and sponsors continues to underpin the club's future.

Competition

As joint Competition Managers, Harvey Jones and Nick Leman continued their coordination/fostering of participation at surf carnivals during the year. This area of the club remains important as it provides an enjoyable social experience where patrolling members can improve their skills while benefiting from exposure to other lifesavers across the state. The Nippers also participated in a number of carnivals including the Eastern Regional, and a local club carnival held at Inverloch. Two juniors went on to compete at the State Junior Championships in Warrnambool during March.

Nippers

The Nipper program remains pivotal to feeding our patrolling membership base. It is a valuable program that teaches life skills including beach and water safety, and community involvement.

This season saw the Nipper parents take an active role in delivering this program, a number of parents becoming qualified to deliver accredited training. Their organisational efforts, together with the willing assistance of patrolling members, have seen the delivery of a professional, valuable and enjoyable Nipper program to around 150 children.

Club Facilities

This club continues to operate from the shipping containers while endeavouring to raise the significant funds required to build clubrooms.

In terms of the progress of the project, a master plan was prepared in December 2004 which considered the feasibility in terms of the development of a new clubhouse in the Goroke Street car park area, including location and design issues with respect to planning and development within coastal areas. On the basis of the master plan, including building concept plans, the club commenced stakeholder consultation culminating in the lodgement of a planning permit application with the Bass Coast Shire Council seeking permission for the use and construction of a clubhouse.

The council subsequently granted a permit for the clubhouse subject of a number of conditions, however, the permit was the subject of a Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (VCAT) appeal. In December 2006, VCAT finalised their decision in support of the planning permit, subject to some further conditions.

A special word of thanks to Sinclair Knight Mertz (SKM) for providing free expert consulting support in order to present our best defence to the tribunal. Without this substantial support a very different result may have eventuated. The club has since formed a building sub-committee responsible for raising the appropriate funds.

The future of the club continues to be bright with growing membership and participation. The enthusiasm of the members will be paramount in securing the club's long term viability. That is, planning of, financing and building the clubrooms and securing a robust membership that enables life saving services to be delivered in a friendly but professional environment.

Chief Instructor's Report

This season started with a changing of the guard, Vivienne French took a step back and handed over the training role to myself. I would like to acknowledge the enormous amount of work Viv has put in over the years to drive training in the club. Viv is still active and continues to assist in the background and is always available and willing to provide advice or guidance.

Taking over the role of Chief Instructor has been challenging especially given my relatively short experience in life saving. A lot of encouragement has come from those around the club and district, especially Barb and Tony Webb who have assisted greatly over the last year and continue to show wonderful support to our club and have enabled us to start to address some of the critical skill shortages such as IRB drivers.

Personally this season was about learning the ropes, continuing the focus on programs that had run previously and commencing the development of longer term strategies to support the club's training needs. The following is a brief summary of the key activities undertaken during the season.

The season kicked off with the Luther College Bronze camp at the beginning of December arranged by Heather Kerr. A total of 13 Bronze Medallions were awarded at the end of the camp. This camp was followed by requalification day on Sunday the 10th of December at which a number of Inverloch and other club members gained proficiency awards for the patrol season. The following week was the traditional ISLSC Bronze camp take place this event being also a great social occasion. Eleven new members gained qualifications aided by a large support crew lead by Anastasia including; Harvey, Nick, Hilary, Tara, Ella, Eve, and Caitlin. The new members trained at this camp are crucial to maintaining patrols over summer and I thank all of those who made a contribution.

Early in the New Year summer Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) training commenced. This training was held over five weekends and was aimed at getting some more Nipper parents and those aged 13 and over, formal qualifications. Fifteen members participated in the program with four Bronze Medallions and eleven Surf Rescue Certificates awarded; a record number for summer training. A number of these members went on to patrol on a regular basis and made a critical contribution to the club. Well done to all. Also during January some members were able to attend and intensive training camp at Waratah SLSC. This camp was a opportunity to attain a large number of skills and awards over a week. Awards attained included Advanced Resuscitation Certificate (ARC), Defibrillation, Senior First Aid & Spinal Management. Feedback was positive and hopefully this opportunity will be available again, it will assist us to train members in these more specialised areas.

A shortage of Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) drivers to fully resource patrols, meant a training course under the guidance of Russell Stewart from Venus Bay SLSC was arranged. Russell spent a lot of time driving between the two clubs and training our members and I would like to thank him for this commitment. As a result we have three additional Silver Medallion holders and a new IRB Crew award which will assist us greatly in the 2007/8 season.

Looking forward to next season, there are a number of key areas we will be focusing on to continue to build club capability. These include:

- A more visible calendar of training activities.
- Fostering more training activities within the district across clubs.
- Encourage more award holders to become training officers.
- Utilise training resources and opportunities provided by LSV more effectively
- Commence development of a more structured organisation to support training activities (it can be too much for one person).

These initiatives align with a broader strategic plan which is being developed for the club and will be communicated in the near future. I would again like to thank everyone who assisted with training over the season and congratulate all those who achieved new awards. It was fantastic to see the excitement and enthusiasm of members who thought they had no chance of making the standard only to find they starred on the day, keep it up next season.

Nippers Report

The junior activities or 'Nippers' section of the club has been growing from strength to strength over every season since the clubs inception. Nipper activities centre on learning surf safety and surf skills in a relaxed fun environment. Nationally catering for children aged between 7 to 13 years of age, Inverloch's Nipper program runs over an intensive two week summer period with beach and water activities all supported by qualified instructors.

Four parents completed the Age Management course in October 2006 to support the 06-07 season. A small number of Nippers took the opportunity to train at the Mentone Life saving Club who hosted the Age Manager's course, training hard on the bay. It was a great opportunity for them to get in the water and not just be summer holiday Nippers.

Leaders and Age Managers responded quickly and with the utmost care and professionalism to any issues or injuries on the beach and during the program, requiring minimum support from paid beach patrol. One Nipper required a spinal response from organisers which thankfully resulted in a full recovery. Four volunteer parent helpers had obtained their Working with Children Check (WWC) in preparation for the 06-07 season and it is expected by Life Saving Victoria (LSV) that all parent helpers will gain this by 1 July 2008.

A requirement of LSV is for Nippers to complete their 'S' Badge particularly to compete in all events at surf carnivals. Participants may receive a training 'T' badge if they are not yet able to achieve competence to the 'S' badge. For future reference, given some concerns regarding the competence of some participants in 06 - 07 it is expected that children participating in the Inverloch Nipper program be at a minimum water confident and have water skills to enable them to enjoy the program.

Nipper competition is an option for those children wishing to compete for Inverloch against other surf life saving clubs. Inverloch held the local club competition with Venus Bay, Cape Patterson and Wonthaggi clubs participating. This is invaluable experience for all children who participated, especially regarding the beach and surf skills required to compete in surf carnivals. Tom Cullen from Life Saving Victoria visited Inverloch and provided invaluable support during this carnival. Inverloch also developed some significant team spirit which culminated in some serious chanting which along with our sea of red and yellow apparel, it was quite inspiring.

Nipper carnivals are held across the state with Inverloch actively participating with members at the Eastern Regional Carnival held at Waratah (Sandy Point) in January. Success at this carnival led two Nippers to compete in the State Championships in Warrnam-

bool in March.

As with any community inspired club, volunteers are the key stone to its activities success. Many people supported the Nipper program to ensure its success in the 06-07 season. Junior sub committee members and their families with additional support from families of participating children worked throughout 06 to prepare for program with improved planning and infrastructure. Sponsors we also sourced to support fundraising during the program e.g. daily sausage sizzle. Donations were also gathered through the sale of program related photos.

Additional activities were organized for Nippers including a group trip to the pictures to see Happy Feet in Wonthaggi. Successful season opening and closing evenings were held at the Inverloch RSL. With certificates and awards presented to all Nippers present. Leaders were also recognized and congratulated on their huge commitment to the program.

As the program enters the future many Nippers will move through to the Youth Involvement Program (YIPS) being initiated for 07-08. This year several of those young people graduating from the Nipper program obtained their Surf Life saving Certificate (SRC) and participated in patrols in the later part of the season.

Feedback was sourced from parents and families of participants on the programs completion with positive feedback around program structure and flow consistently provided. Commitment to the program by participants over the two week period was highlighted as a concern by parents and families, given the requirement to limit numbers to maintain a high level of safety and program quality standard. Also the concern of local families wanting to play a role in club growth was highlighted regarding access to the program.

The 06-07 program was a great success and congratulations must go out to organisers, leaders and participants. All Nippers were able to participate throughout the program showing respect and responsibility while engaged in the program.

Competition

Winter of 2006 had a few of us braving the cold conditions to either travel to Inverloch or paddle locally at Beaumaris. Beaumaris Life saving Club generously offered hospitality and hot showers as well as loaning us some skis, allowing us some storage space so that we could get plenty of off-season practice. 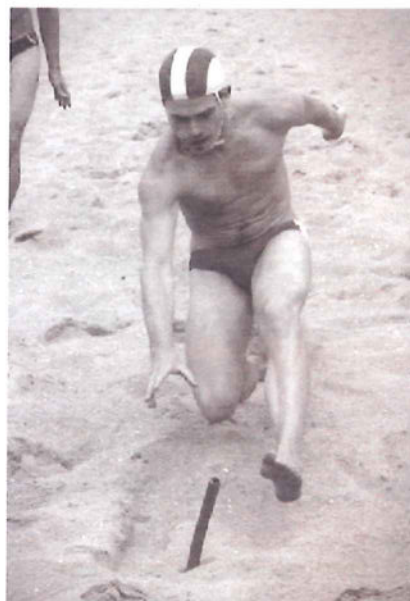
