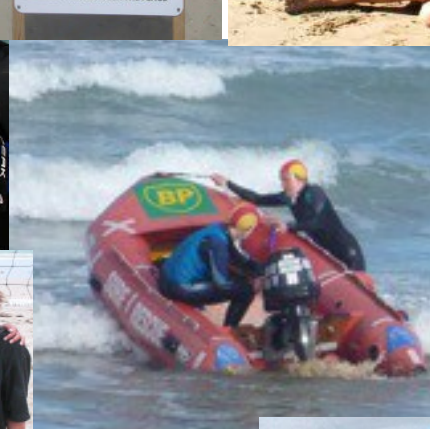

# President

It has been another sensational year for the Club, with no doubt the announcement and commencement of construction of the Clubhouse, the absolute highlight. Continued growth in all areas of the Club, and results on and off the beach, also played a significant part.

## **Events**

### Surf and Sand Fun Run

## **Membership**

Membership is still sky rocketing, up from 416 last year to over 522, with 164 active members contributing to the safety of the beach (4,330 patrolling hours) and many others contributing to the health of the Club. The construction of the Clubhouse has sparked more interest and I hope to see further strong growth. We continue to see fantastic enthusiasm and numbers via the natural progression of Nippers into SRC's and our bronze camps, in particular from our association with Lutheran College.

## **Finances**

We posted a healthy surplus of \$227,535 (\$68,858 last year) due to grants, sponsorships and donations and continue to grow our base of surf life saving equipment (\$125,855 of fixed assets). Grants, sponsorships and donations are a key funding source for the club representing a substantial component of income. Our cash reserves of \$359,514 are primarily reserved for the Clubhouse construction.

## **Equipment and Support**

Equipment purchases continued in order to maintain and extend our services, and included more nipper boards, safety vests, an IRB racing motor and trailer, various other first aid equipment, etc. Thanks to Rohan & Megan White and Rod and Tennille Hall of the Western Beach Caravan Park for their support in providing accommodation to our

patrolling members. Some of members managed to test the friendship, therefore we especially appreciate their support. Also, many thanks go to other key supporters:

Guy and Teresa Copley of Copley Enterprises; and

Blair Hodges of First National South Coast Real Estate for 10 years of fantastic support that enabled the Club to purchase many life saving equipment necessities.

Well done to Gayle Morris for securing a number of grants during the year – sounds like a permanent job. As always, the generosity and support of members, supporters and sponsors continues to underpin the club's future.

## **Competition**

Competition is an important part of surf life saving as it provides an enjoyable social experience where Nippers and patrolling members can improve their skills while benefiting from exposure to other life savers across the state. The club organised another State Carnival at our beach and as many as 500 Nippers took part with around 1,000 associated visitors. Thanks to David Greenwood, Leanne du Plessis, Brendan Swaine, and the many others that assisted for organising a great event and our own George Misson for being Carnival Referee.

In its second year, the IRB racing team has provided a boost to our driver and crew morale. Well done all and especially to Rob O'Neill for all his hard work coaching and mentoring the team, the "flying squad".

It was great to see Inverloch's first ever medals at senior carnivals (at the Lorne Surf Lifesaving Carnival). Congratulations to:

Yet another fantastic season of Nippers with 137 taking to the beach over the first 3 weeks of January 2010. It is a great forum for children to learn about water safety, improve their beach and surf skills, forge long lasting friendships, and learn a sense of community. Thanks to all those that helped make this possible and especially the Nippers Committee (led by Angela Malan), Nipper helpers and the fantastic water safety.

## Club Facilities

This time last year I was writing about how the club operated from shipping containers while we were endeavouring to raise the significant funds required to build a clubhouse. As you know the Club's building sub-committee managed to secure \$500,000 from a state government grant program and now we are in the midst of constructing a purpose built home at an approximate cost of \$1.3M.

While the Club has accumulated significant amount from its extensive fundraising efforts, there are a number of key groups that have been instrumental in ensuring the Club was credible. These include the Inverloch and District Community Bank, the Bass Coast Shire Council, the Inverloch Jazz Festival, Inverloch Lions, Inverloch Rotary, LJ Hooker (Inverloch), Bass Coast Community Foundation, Thiess Degremont, various other stakeholders and the many "Buy a Brick" supporters.

Thanks to the Building Sub-committee, including Alan Bolton and David Schultz, with a special thanks to Trevor Dando for all his hard work and expertise with finalising the plans, statutory approvals and construction management.

A super special thanks to those personal guarantors who put up their pledges in order to get the project over the line. Without you the project would never have obtained approval whatsoever – FACT!

## Congratulations

Congratulations to all those members who attained qualifications during the year. A number of willing participants were successful in achieving bronze medallions and Surf Rescue Certificates via the various camps and training sessions during the year. In particular, thanks to Chris Malan and Hilary Hughes for this high standard of training. A concentrated Regional Training Camp was again held at Waratah beach during January, which saw a number of our patrolling members put through the

hoops returning with many new qualifications, skills and experiences. Well done to all.

# Training
