PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Season 2014-15 has been challenging for all members due to a number of factors, the major one being Mother Nature and the effect of inclement weather on patrols, Nippers and our new patrol tower. It is pleasing to see members of our life saving community come together to support each other and continue to contribute to the success of Inverloch Surf Life Saving Club. A big thanks to all our members who have contributed to this success.

The season commenced on a high note with the installation of the new patrol tower in early December. The tower was fully operational by Christmas and proved to be a huge asset for our volunteer patrollers and paid lifeguards over January. Unfortunately Mother Nature continues to ravage our much-loved beach and providing us with ongoing challenges to protect the patrol tower. The changes in weather also proved testing for our Nippers during their program and has had an ongoing effect on kiosk takings. All our members are to be commended for continuing to patrol the beach regardless of weather conditions and supporting an excellent Nipper program for our Nippers.

Our membership for season 2014-15 was 678 members with 171 of these actively patrolling the beach across 5 patrols. Our strong patrolling list is the envy of many clubs in the state. This is a reflection of the hard work and commitment by Nat Jowett our Club Captain and his team of Patrol Captains and ISR teams. Nippers continues to be very popular with an all-time record of 206 Nippers, including 30 SRC candidates, the largest number ever at Inverloch. Nippers continues to be an excellent introduction for juniors to form a love for lifesaving and the beach. This would not be possible without Teagan Thom and her team of volunteers including parent helpers, age managers and the water safety team.

Opportunities exist in many areas for members to be involved. From bronze camps, Nipper programs and competition, the YIPs program, summer and winter (IRB) competition teams and the surfboat competition team. The avenues to be involved in our club continue to grow and have success. Many thanks to the coaches, leaders, officials and managers who give up their time to run these and encourage others to be involved.

Our members continue to make the most of the leadership development opportunities available at district, state and national level. It is very pleasing to see Inverloch represented at the various camps and programs and hear the positive feedback concerning our members. In addition, as you will read in other reports, the success of our athletes continues to grow at a state and national level and is a reflection of the passion and dedication of our members. Congratulations to all our medallists and those who achieved personal bests.

I am very pleased to report that the club is in a sound financial position. Many thanks to Rob O'Neill, treasurer, for the many hours he dedicates to the financial health of the club. A big thank you to Sylvia Collett and her assistant Oliver as well as the team of volunteers for the many hours they put into running the club kiosk. Also a big thanks to Ruth Young for managing club uniform sales.

Presentation Night held in July was a great success and it was wonderful to have such a great attendance by members to recognise and applaud achievements over the past year. The success of Inverloch SLSC depends on the commitment and contributions of all members. We are a strong community and everyone must play a part in contributing to the growth and success of our club. The board of directors and their committees spend many hours ensuring our club is able to provide a safe, caring and supportive environment for all members. I ask that all members contribute to our success by helping in some way, don't let a small group carry the load. Members are our most important asset. Whatever contribution you can make to our club is valued and we thank you for it.

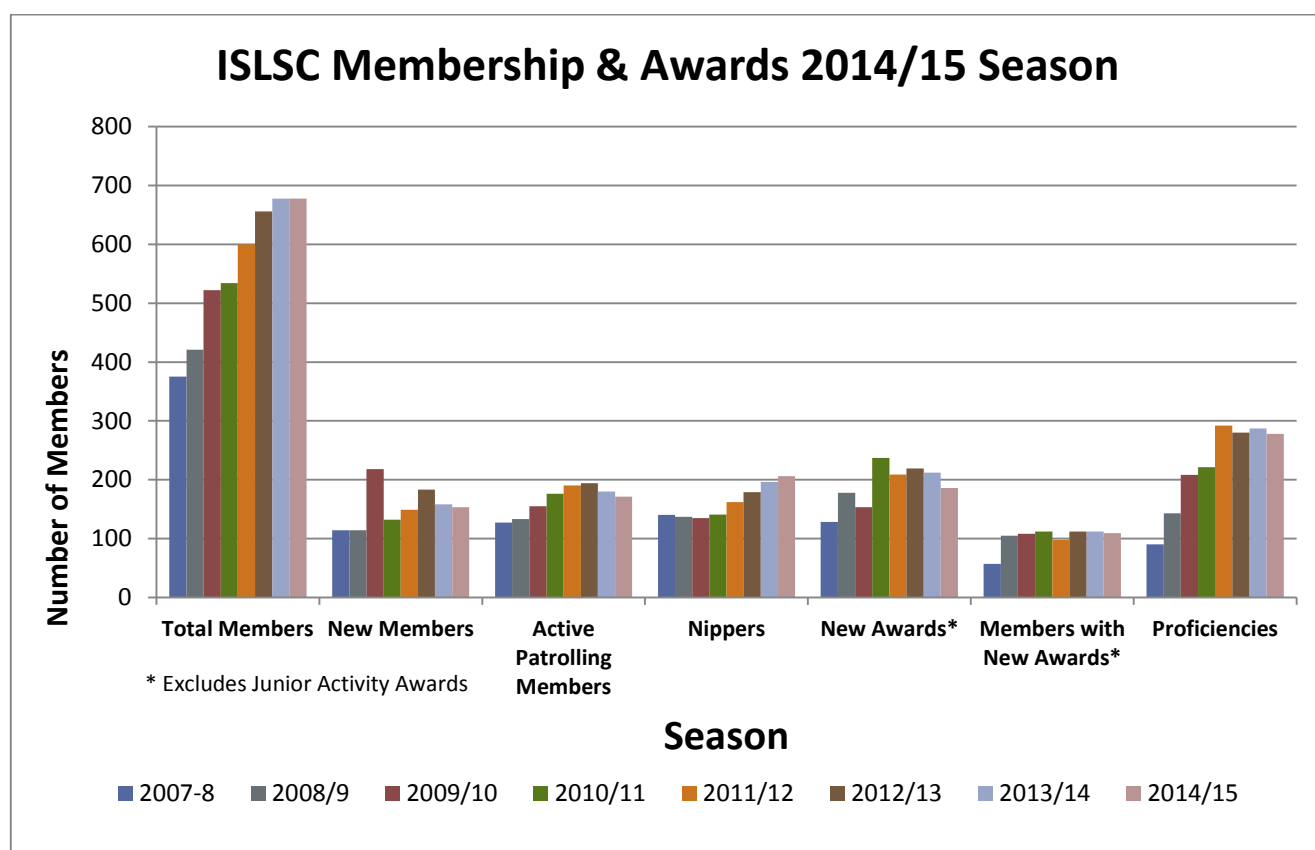


MEMBERSHIP REPORT



Total membership of 678 this season was exactly the same as season 2013/14. The lack of growth in memberships is primarily due to the decision by Luther College not to conduct their annual Bronze Camp at Inverloch this season. This is also reflected in the reduction of active patrolling members of 5%, 171 active members patrolled this year, and a reduction in new awards by 12%, predominantly Bronze Medallions – 65 awards in 2013/14 vs. 41 in this season.

Nipper numbers were again up this season with a total of 206. Of these, a record number of 30 nippers from the under 14 group took up the opportunity to do their SRC resulting in a 149% growth in Cadet members. This was a great result and assures healthy numbers to support patrols into the future.



Gender balance of the club remains a strength with a 52/48% split of female/male participation. Balance is consistent across all age groups. Imbalance noted in last year’s report in the Cadet category has been addressed with significant increase in male participation rate.

Female representation on the Board decreased significantly this season with only 2 female board members (30%). The board is concerned about this and will continue to look at increasing female participation at a senior leadership level in the club.

Local membership (Inverloch & surrounds) represents 23% of total membership. Local membership has declined by 7% over the last 2 years. This is disappointing given the promotion of club programs such as nippers and bronze camp in local papers and schools. Plans to conduct bronze camps with local secondary schools are being developed to improve local participation.

FINANCIALS



Last year I finished the report with the following lines:

“We weren’t complacent and we have come through a challenging time with flying colours!!”

You know what – we did!!

We weren’t complacent and we did come through the challenge but it was a very close call indeed.

Our State Government Emergency Services Minister (after much pressure was applied) finally came good with \$70K towards the new tower. We have spent another \$15k ourselves fitting it out and making sure that we had a tower to be proud of and one where Patrollers wanted to go and keep an eye on the public at our beach!!



To all those involved especially Kane Worthy Constructions and his band of merry helpers and suppliers who made it happen in what seemed like record time – a massive thank you for a job incredibly well done!!

Now however we face a new challenge.....

What “The Man” maketh ‘Mother Nature’ is doing her best to take away!!



The Club's Board and the Bass Coast Shire are working towards a solution to this little problem but one thing is for certain – it will not be a cheap exercise whatever the solution may be!!

For example: To remove the Tower from the beach is \$10,000 just for the crane.....

OVERVIEW

On the financial side of things we managed to hold our own. Taking all the smoke and mirrors out of the report (depreciation etc.) we showed a reasonable profit.

Our asset base grew by \$63K whilst our bank accounts only shrank by \$35K. A bit of good bargain hunting, some wins on small grants and a few "End of Season" sales by suppliers allowed us to continue replacing and expanding our asset base for Operations, Nippers and the club as a whole.

Overall income was up slightly by \$43K and expenses were down a very pleasing \$61K compared to the previous year. The highlight was our electricity bill that reduced by 1/3 (or \$2K) compared to last year, coming in at \$4k as opposed to \$6K in 2013/14 and nearly \$8K the year before that. Much of this is due to the changeover to natural gas for the hot water and whilst our gas bill trebled I can happily live with an annual gas bill jumping from \$300 to \$1,000 a year. My undying gratitude goes to Rinnai (Greg Ellis) for this change of fortune.....

I will however continue to nag about the lights, TV's and air con's being left on all the time. No different to you being at home really - always a parent nagging about something!! 😊

What's disappointing is that the income increase was due to the \$70K 'gifted' from the State Government. If you take that out of the equation operating income actually fell by over \$27,000 for the season.

Can we pinpoint a cause for this drop??? Yes – we can!!

Every area of the club was down in their efforts – simple as that!!

Despite a magnificent effort from Sylvia Collett in the Kiosk this season, profits were down by \$4K on the previous year. A run of bad weather and a significant lack of volunteer assistance made Sylvia's job incredibly demanding and quite simply one person cannot do it by themselves.

Nippers had a good year but not a great year. General fund raising was at an all-time low and Comp Team's seem to be living off savings rather than replacing what they spend. Eventually it will all catch up and the cheque book will, at some point, be closed to all those extra activities that we so often take for granted.

How do we reverse this trend???

Simple – put your hand up and get involved.....

Nipper parents – do a shift in the kiosk one weekend after your summer holiday is over. All club members make yourselves available for tin rattles, fund raisers and functions run for your enjoyment and benefit.

If you see a problem, don't ignore it, get in there and help someone to fix it!! I can honestly say that the small group of devotee's that do all the work are getting very tired and if they don't get some assistance very soon.....

THANK YOU'S FOR SEASON 2014-2015

Sylvia – thank you for putting your hand up and taking on the kiosk. In a nutshell this service pays to put Patrols on the beach each season and for that some 200 Patrollers should also thank you!!

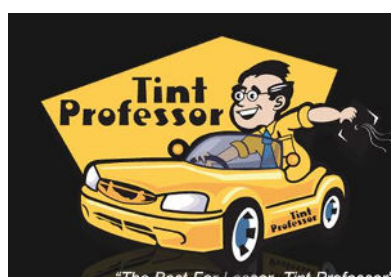
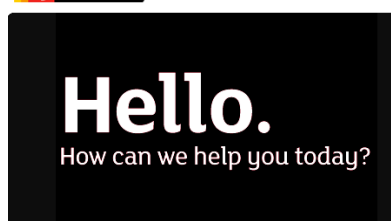
