# President's Message

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It has been another strong, busy and rewarding season for Inverloch Surf Life Saving Club.

At its core, our club exists to keep people safe, build capability, and bring our community together. This season we have done all three very well.

Our patrol members again delivered an outstanding service to the Inverloch community and the thousands of visitors who came to our beach. Across the season, our members completed more than 6,000 patrol hours, undertook 3,581 preventative actions, provided first aid when needed, and responded to one rescue. These numbers tell an important story. Most of the work our lifesavers do happens before an emergency occurs. It is the quiet, disciplined and often unseen work of our volunteers that keeps people out of trouble in the first place.

Our training outcomes were equally impressive. The club supported 151 course completions across a broad range of awards, including Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, IRB Crew, IRB Driver, Rescue Water Craft Operator, Side-by-Side Vehicle Operator, First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation. Skills maintenance was also strongly supported, with 144 members completing their annual requirements. This is a credit to our trainers, assessors, facilitators and the members who continue to put in the time to stay current, capable and ready.

Our Nipper program continues to be one of the club's great strengths. We again saw record numbers across both our peak and off-peak programs, reflecting the quality of the program, the commitment of our Age

Managers, Water Safety teams and parent volunteers, and the strong connection local families have with the club.

The work around the club also continued at pace. We completed important improvements in the garage, including the racking and wash tank works. We also secured grant funding to upgrade the floors upstairs and downstairs, and the recent flooring works have made a real difference to the clubhouse's presentation and functionality. The upgrade to the oven and hot water service is another practical improvement that will support our functions, bar operations, club events and the many volunteers who keep people fed and watered.



Our bar, apparel, BBQ, kiosk, social media, administration, maintenance, sponsorship and fundraising volunteers all deserve special recognition. These areas are not always as visible as Patrollers or Nippers, but they are essential to the club's operations.

We also continued to represent the club strongly in the broader community, including at community events, erosion meetings, ANZAC Day commemorations, LSV forums, and in local media. The ongoing coastal erosion challenge remains one of the most significant issues facing the club, and we will continue to advocate strongly for sensible, timely and practical support to protect our beach, our facility and our community role.



To our Board, Senior Leadership Team, sub-committees, patrol captains, trainers, Age Managers, water safety volunteers, bar team, apparel team, maintenance crew, sponsors, families and every member who put their hand up this season, thank you.

A surf club does not run on good intentions alone. It runs because people give their time, skills and energy, often while balancing work, family, and everything else life throws at them. Inverloch is fortunate to have so many people who care enough to contribute.

It has been a privilege to serve as President again this season. Our club is in good shape, but more importantly, it is full of good people. That is what will keep us moving forward.

## **GROWTH AND ENGAGEMENT**

The 2025/26 season was another season of real growth for Inverloch SLSC, with total membership up 25% over the past two seasons. Behind that growth, our membership data also gives us a clearer picture of where our energy needs to go next.

## **MEMBER COMMUNICATION**

Keeping members informed and connected remained a priority this season, with communication running across social media, our newsletter, the club website and Team App. Together these channels give members multiple ways to stay across patrol rosters, events, achievements and club news, and continue to be the backbone of how we reach our growing membership base throughout the year.

## **SOCIAL MEDIA**

Our social media presence continued to build on the strong foundation of previous seasons, under Ava Rose Houben-Carter, with Instagram alone reaching over 120,000 views this season. This growing reach has become one of our most effective tools for showcasing the work of our members, promoting club events, and connecting with the broader Inverloch community. Ava Rose continues to do a fantastic job in this role; well done Ava Rose!

## **MEMBER RECOGNITION**

This season we reintroduced a 100+ Hour Celebration, held on 28 March 2026, to properly recognise the members who go above and beyond with their patrol commitment. It was a great chance to bring these members together and thank them directly for a level of dedication that keeps the club running operationally an initiative we're looking to build on further next season.

## **EVENTS & SOCIAL COMMITTEE**

Thank you to our Social Committee — Mathias Twomey, Saskia Cehun, Holly Foster and myself — for the work that went into member events again this season. It was a season with plenty planned, and while not everything on the calendar made it to the beach or the clubrooms as scheduled, a number of events were successfully delivered thanks to members across the club stepping up to help run and coordinate them. Thank you to everyone who pitched in, whether as part of the committee or not.

Moving forward, the Events Committee is being restructured for next season with the goal of delivering a greater diversity of events that cater to more of our membership base.

## MEMBERSHIP DEMOGRAPHICS

Inverloch SLSC continues to grow, with total membership up 25% over the past two seasons. Behind that growth, the shape of our membership is shifting significantly.

Our junior program remains the engine of the club. Under 13s now make up over 30% of total membership, up from 26% last season, and more than triple the share it held five seasons ago.

Alongside this, our 35–44 age group continues to grow as a share of the club, now over 18%, up from 16% last season, reflecting the number of parents joining and staying involved as their children come through Nippers.

We're also seeing early signs of a turnaround in our 25–34 cohort, which grew slightly as a share of membership this season after four consecutive seasons of decline; the first positive movement (numbers wise, of course!) in this age group in years.

The area requiring the most attention is our 13–24 membership. Our 13–17 cohort's share of membership fell significantly this season, down from almost 22% to around 17%. Our 18–24 cohort has fallen for five consecutive seasons, down from over 22% of membership five years ago to under 7% today. Put simply, we are excellent at bringing young families into the club, but we are losing a meaningful proportion of our members somewhere between finishing Nippers and becoming an adult patrolling member.

## LOOKING AHEAD

This membership shift is the clearest challenge facing the club heading into next season. We don't yet have a fixed plan, but investing in the longevity of our youth; keeping our teens and young adults engaged, connected, and seeing a genuine pathway for themselves at Inverloch beyond Nippers will be a top priority for this portfolio going into 2026/27.

## CLUBHOUSE MANAGER

The past 12 months have been another successful and busy year for the Inverloch Surf Life Saving Club clubhouse.

During the Christmas holiday period, our bunk rooms operated at full capacity, with accommodation occupied every night. Several members generously took on the responsibility of supervising our under-18 members, and I would like to sincerely thank them for their commitment and support. Throughout the year, new mattress protectors were installed on every bunk bed, and the accommodation areas were regularly reorganised and maintained. The upstairs Patrol Lounge was also well utilised by patrolling members and served as a valuable space for Nippers training activities.



The training room continued to be one of the most versatile and frequently used areas within the clubhouse. It hosted training sessions, meetings, and provided a gathering place for members throughout the season, along with a wide range of functions including birthday celebrations and weddings. With the flexibility of our large tables, the space can comfortably seat up to 80 guests for evening events.

Our bar operations had another outstanding season. Open to both members and the public on most summer evenings, the bar provided an important social hub while also generating valuable revenue for the club. I would like to extend a special thank you to our volunteer bar staff, whose dedication and hard work ensured the smooth running of operations throughout the year.

Significant upgrades and improvements have been completed across the clubhouse over the past year. These included resurfacing all upstairs and downstairs flooring, installing a new commercial oven in the kitchen, replacing hand dryers in the toilet facilities, and installing shower screens in the men's showers. In addition, all routine maintenance requirements were completed, including electrical testing and tagging, as well as regular fire safety inspections. Bass Coast Shire Council conducted regular inspections of both the bunk rooms and kitchen facilities throughout the year.

As we continue to improve our operations, we are reviewing rostering arrangements and identifying further enhancements to better manage clubhouse activities during peak periods next season.

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## Lifesaving

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The 2025/2026 season has been one of growth, collaboration and continual improvement across the Lifesaving Services portfolio. Spanning Operations, Training, Membership & Leadership Development, Nippers and Competition, the focus this season has been on strengthening the structures, systems and leadership that support the delivery of our core lifesaving activities.

A key achievement has been the continued development of our Senior Leadership Team. Following a period of transition, the portfolio leaders have worked collaboratively to establish strong working relationships, improve communication and develop a shared vision across all areas of lifesaving. Rather than operating independently, our portfolios have increasingly worked together to deliver programs, solve challenges and support one another, creating a more connected and effective leadership group.

This season also saw the strengthening of Senior Leadership Team subcommittees. These groups have broadened opportunities for members to be involved and contribute to the club, encouraged shared ownership of projects and provided valuable leadership experiences for emerging volunteers. As these committees continue to develop, they will play an important role in succession planning and ensuring the long-term sustainability of our club.

Considerable work has also occurred behind the scenes to strengthen governance and administration. Across the portfolio we have improved planning processes, enhanced digital systems, introduced more consistent documentation and developed strategic resources to support future leaders. While these improvements are often unseen by members, they provide stronger foundations for the club and reduce reliance on individual knowledge by creating more sustainable systems.



Leadership development has remained a consistent priority throughout the season. It has been encouraging to see members stepping into new leadership opportunities, undertaking further training and mentoring others within their respective areas. Investing in our volunteers not only strengthens our current programs but also ensures the club is well positioned for the future.

Perhaps the most pleasing outcome this season has been the culture that continues to develop across the portfolio. There has been a genuine willingness from members to collaborate, share ideas and support one another, regardless of portfolio boundaries. This culture has strengthened our ability to deliver quality programs while creating a more enjoyable and rewarding experience for those who volunteer their time.

While each portfolio has achieved significant outcomes this season, those achievements are best reflected within their individual reports. I would like to acknowledge the outstanding work of our Operations, Training, Membership & Leadership Development, Nippers and Competition leaders, whose commitment and professionalism have driven the success of the club throughout the year.

# Patrol Operations

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This season has once again demonstrated the extraordinary power of people committed to a shared purpose. Season 25/26 saw our active patrollers dedicate over 6,000 patrolling hours to keeping our community safe between the red and yellow flags, the massive patrol output from our members. From our first patrol on 8 November 2025 through to the close of the season on 19 April 2026. Patrols were filled with skill, efficiency, spirit, and a genuine desire to give back to our community, and it showed in every interaction on the beach.

What set this season apart was the intentional investment in our people and structures before a single flag went up. From a refreshed leadership model and new Patrol Captain resources and support, to wellbeing workshops and a re energised Patrol Leadership Team, the groundwork laid in the pre-season carried us through one of our busiest summers yet.

This season we introduced a refreshed Operations leadership structure, most notably the creation of two Vice Club Captain positions to support the Club Captain and strengthen leadership capacity across the portfolio. VCC of Gear and Equipment and VCC of People & Patrol. This change has allowed us to provide more direct support to our Patrol Captains and teams, share the operational load, and build a deeper leadership pipeline for future seasons. Thankyou to both Xavier Korbel and Sam Dimopoulos for succeeding in these roles.



## LIFE SAVING OPERATIONS COMMITTEE (LSOC)

This season welcomed both returning and new faces to the LSOC, each playing a vital role in ensuring the club's patrolling and emergency response operates at the highest standard.

The committee held regular meetings throughout the season, reviewed the Strategic Plan, developed clearer approval processes within the LSOC structure, updated the Patrollers Handbook on Team App, maintained and improved their areas, maintained our 365-day emergency callout capability - including a review and refresh of the club's Emergency Contact List, and so so much more. Thank you to every LSOC member for the hours of unseen work that keep our operations running.

## PRE-SEASON PREPARATION

A huge amount of work went into setting the season up for success:

- **Patrol Survey:** Nearly 70 responses were received from members, directly shaping patrol allocations, leadership appointments, and how we communicate and support our teams.
- **Patrol Roster:** The 2025/26 roster was published early, aligned with the Bass region, loaded into Surfguard, Team App, and the club calendar - giving members maximum time to plan their season.
- **First Aid Room:** Fully restocked and summer-ready, with oxygen regulators serviced.
- **IRBs & Vehicles:** All IRBs accounted for and serviced; trailer hitches and ATV tyres repaired ahead of the season.
- **Team App:** Reset and reconfigured as our primary patrol and operations communication hub, with permissions reviewed across all leadership.





## GEAR INSPECTIONS

Preparing our equipment for the season was a two-stage effort this year.

Our internal gear inspection and audit weekend saw members clear out, clean, reorganise, and account for all equipment across the garage, first aid room, patrol tower, gear shed, and patrol lounge. Every item was checked, faulty equipment was identified and booked for repair, and our GEMS asset register was updated to accurately reflect the club's resources, all fuelled by a pizza provided by the club. This work also set the standard we ask of every patrol and training course: leave the club better than you found it.



The annual LSV Gear Inspection followed in October and was completed successfully, with all rescue equipment checked and documented to LSV standards. One equipment issue identified with the Zodiac was logged with LSV and SLISA for resolution. Thank you to our Gear and Equipment team and every member who supported this essential, unglamorous, and absolutely critical work.

## WORKING BEE

We kicked off the season with a fantastic Working Bee on 2 November 2025, coordinated by Gear Stewards Jake Hetrelezis and Morrie Tatnall. From scrubbing and painting to sorting, organising, and fixing, members rolled up their sleeves and gave the club a much-needed refresh. Thank you to every person who gave their time, your effort creates the environment we all show up to.



## PLT WEEKEND

Our Patrol Leadership Team came together for a productive and energising PLT Weekend on 8-9 November 2025, a comprehensive program designed to ensure our leaders hit the beach aligned, skilled, and connected. Across the weekend, the PLT worked through:

- **Communication and leadership development:** Effective communication strategies, leadership styles, conflict resolution, and engaging patrollers (particularly our younger members) on patrol.
- **Equipment and procedures review:** Hands-on sessions covering IRB, ATV, and surf truck procedures, maintenance logs, pre- and post-patrol checks, and the latest safety protocols.
- **Role-specific training:** Dedicated sessions for each PLT position, from Patrol Captains and Vice Captains to First Aid Officers, ART, IRB Drivers and Crew, and Mentors, covering key responsibilities, decision-making, and reporting.
- **Emergency response scenarios:** Simulated emergencies with structured debriefs, including after-hours callout procedures and incident reporting.
- **Season planning workshop:** A shared dinner where the team workshopped patroller engagement events, recognition ideas, and improvements to callout processes for the season ahead.

Engagement from all PLT members was outstanding, and the weekend set a strong, rescue-ready tone for the season. A special thank you to our President and Vice Club Captain (People & Patrol) for cooking the Saturday evening meal for the group.





## GEAR AND EQUIPMENT

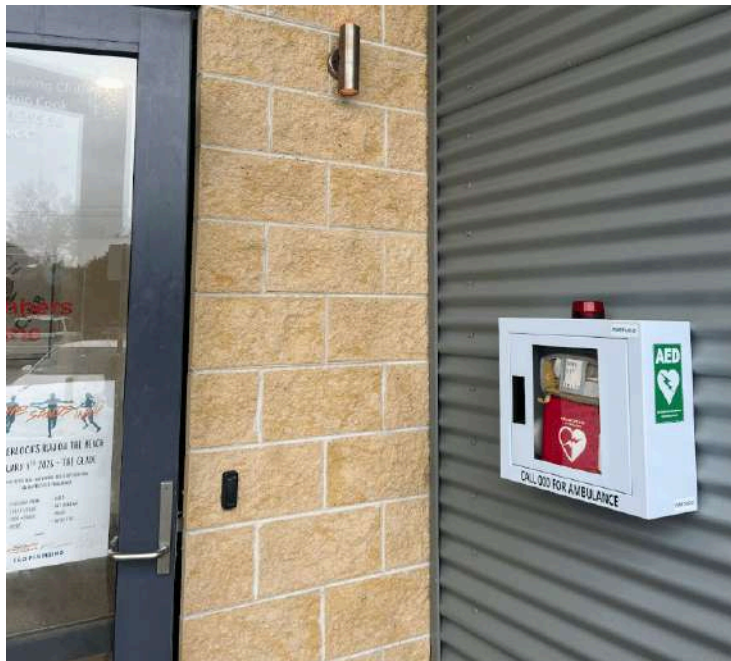
Maintaining and upgrading our rescue capability remained a priority this season. We welcomed the following additions:

- 3 new soft rescue boards (Bennett Surf)
- New binoculars and a motor trolleys, generously funded by the Rotary Club of Inverloch
- A Public Access Defibrillator and bleed control kit
- Garage reconfiguration to accommodate LSV Rescue Water Craft (RWC), with the club now supporting RWC operations on the Bass Coast



Alongside these additions, ongoing maintenance across IRBs, vehicles, and patrol equipment ensured everything remained safe, reliable, and rescue-ready throughout the season.

## PUBLIC ACCESS DEFIBRILLATOR



This season, a Public Access Defibrillator (AED) was officially installed at the club, located on the wall to the right of the front door and accessible 24/7 to members and the broader community. The unit includes a defibrillator and bleed control kit and is registered on the GoodSAM app.

This is a meaningful addition to our community safety capability and reflects our commitment to lifesaving that extends well beyond the patrol flags.

We also continued to encourage all first-aid trained members to register as GoodSAM responders - in a town without an ambulance station, our members can be the difference on someone's worst day.

## EMERGENCY SERVICES FOUNDATION - WELLBEING WORKSHOP

We were proud to host the Emergency Services Foundation for a deeply valuable Wellbeing Workshop during the pre-season, attended by 37 people including club members, PLT members, leaders from neighbouring clubs, and local emergency personnel. The evening focused on mental health, resilience, and supporting each other through the pressures of lifesaving and emergency response, and received overwhelmingly positive feedback. Thank you to ESF for delivering such a meaningful session.



## PATROL SEASON & STATISTICS

The first patrol of the season was completed by a small but mighty Patrol 2 team, who braved cooler conditions and quieter beaches to set the standard for the months ahead. From there, the season only built: since Boxing Day alone, our volunteers oversaw more than 12,000 members of the public on the beach, and we reached **record numbers of patrollers on duty in a single day** - including newly accredited and enthusiastic SRCs keen to develop their skills and contribute to service delivery.





The standout story of this season's statistics is prevention. Our patrollers performed **3,581 preventative actions** across the season, proactive interventions that stopped incidents before they happened. The result speaks for itself: just one rescue was required all season. This is lifesaving at its best, not dramatic, but deliberate, vigilant, and quietly effective.

- **Patrol Hours:** 6,008, up from 5,558 last season
- **Preventative Actions:** 3,581

Our Patrol Captains and Vice Captains continued to ensure patrol teams operated effectively and were prepared for the demands of a busy summer. With the support of the new induction booklet and regular VCC check-ins, our on-beach leaders were better resourced than ever.



## OPERATING THROUGH COASTAL EROSION



Coastal erosion continued to shape our operations this season. Sandbag works, strong easterlies, and high tides shifted tonnes of sand into and around the club, and the operations team adapted accordingly - utilising alternative beach access points including Pensioners Point and Flat Rocks, adjusting training and IRB usage where conditions required, and maintaining clear communication with patrollers throughout the works.

Despite the disruption, patrol services were maintained without compromise, a credit to the flexibility and professionalism of our teams.

## SPECIAL PATROLS

**YIPs Patrol:** The annual YIPs Patrol on New Year's Day was another outstanding success, bringing youth patrollers together from all patrol groups to develop their lifesaving and leadership skills. A special congratulations to Nelson Karutz for stepping up as Patrol Captain for the first time and keeping the day running smoothly.

**Christmas Volunteer Patrol:** Our volunteer Christmas patrol once again ensured the community was watched over during the festive period - thank you to the members who gave up part of their Christmas to serve.



**Blue Patrol:** Blue Patrol was a great success despite poor conditions, highlighting mental health, wellbeing, belonging, and connection amongst lifesavers. Thanks to Slice of Paradise Bakery for the blue-iced doughnuts, and to Bella and Patrol 3 for making the day happen.

**Pride Patrol:** Held on Saturday 7 February 2026, Pride Patrol celebrated inclusion, diversity, and the strength of our lifesaving community, with patrollers adding a splash of colour to their uniforms.

## VENUS BAY INCIDENT

In January 2026, ISLSC members assisted Venus Bay SLSC and emergency services following the tragic loss of a life at Venus Bay. Those involved demonstrated extraordinary professionalism, composure, and resolve during a deeply difficult operation, and their conduct was a credit to themselves and this club. Following the incident, the operations team undertook a structured debrief, with learnings applied to our out-of-hours response arrangements, Rescue Ready procedures and communications, and a full review of our emergency contact list, ensuring we are even better prepared to support our community and neighbouring clubs when it matters most.

## FIRST AID EVENTS



Our First Aid trained patrollers once again supported the broader community by providing coverage at events across the region, including the Inverloch Equinox Festival, where Patrol 4 provided first aid during patrol hours and volunteers continued coverage into the evening at the Hub and the Glade.



This work builds vital relationships beyond the beach and demonstrates the breadth of skills our members bring to their community.

## AQUATIC RESCUE

**Inverloch Bronze Medallion:** This year's course broke records again, with the highest number of candidates in attendance, requiring split accommodation between the clubhouse and candidates' own homes. 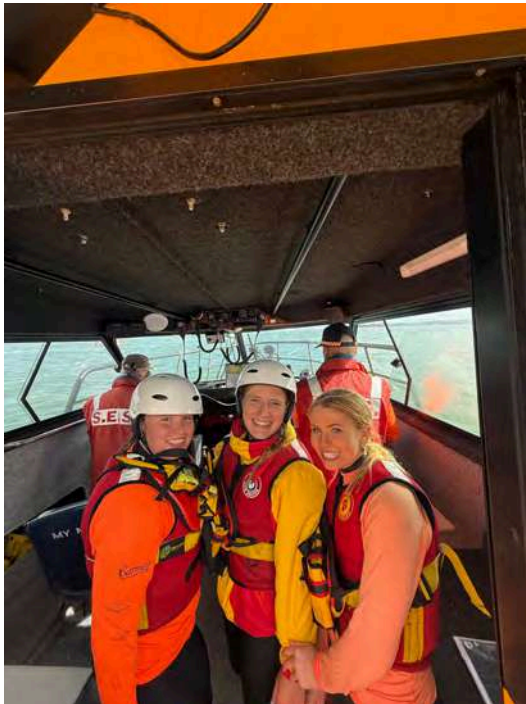

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS

**ILSAR:** This season saw the return of the hugely successful ILSAR Program, enabling 16 members and 9 trainers to improve their complex incident response and search and rescue capabilities, with a strong focus on facilitating relationships with Ambulance Victoria, Victoria Police and the SES.

**New Course:** Inverloch Primary School Program, facilitated by Brydie Smith and Chief Instructor Finley Withers, saw over 120 Inverloch primary school students gain confidence in ocean and inlet swimming.

**New Course:** Flinders College Program, a lifesaving and water safety program for year 11 PE students. Thank you to Finley Withers for organising and to Joshua Robinson, Rhys Dalton and James Harman for running the activities.



## REQUALS

**Introduction of Lifesaving CPR:** Requals changed yet again this season, with the introduction of Lifesaving CPR by Life Saving Victoria, aligned with new research from the Australian Resuscitation Council. This meant more preparation and time during requals to learn the new content. Requal Coordinator Holly Foster planned and coordinated over 5 sessions, requalifying over 309 member awards this season.



## OTHER TRAINING ACHIEVEMENTS

**Chief Instructor Award:** Congratulations to Isabella Perich, who stepped up as head trainer of our SRC program, was mentored to head train the Kew Bronze Medallion, and was signed off as a trainer in our power craft courses.

**Train the Trainer Day:** A new event in our training calendar this season, focused on developing the leadership, confidence and knowledge base of our team of trainers, with sessions from David Morris and Lucy Tate.



**Interagency Achievements:** A new Interagency Coordinator role was introduced this season, held by Xavier Korbel, facilitating multiple search and rescue training sessions with the Inverloch SES unit across courses and patrol weekends, providing our members with real experience to equip them and improve outcomes in actual incidents.

**Cert IV:** Four of our trainers began coursework for a Certificate IV in Training and Assessment this season, made possible by our sponsorship from Bendigo Bank. Good luck to Ella Arnold, David Morris, Jonathan Li and Finley Withers.





## GROWING OUR OPERATIONAL CAPABILITY

Our patrolling capability deepened significantly this season, with members achieving a range of operationally critical qualifications:

- **5 new Rescue Water Craft Operator Certificates** - Directly supporting the club's new RWC capability on the Bass Coast.
- **8 Side-by-Side Vehicle Operator Certificates** - formalising safe operation of our Can-Am and Polaris vehicles on patrol.
- **4 Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue awards** - advanced rescue, rock rescue, and search and rescue capability.
- **2 Silver Medallion Patrol Captain awards** - building our next generation of patrol leaders.
- **15 new IRB Crew and 2 new IRB Drivers** - strengthening powercraft coverage across all patrols.

## OFF-PEAK NIPPERS PROGRAM

This season marked the successful launch of our Off-Peak Nippers Program (soon to be rebranded). Beginning in Term 4, 2025, 53 local nippers took part in our eight-week pilot program, held after school on Wednesday evenings.

This is a program the club has aspired to deliver for many years, providing another pathway for local families to get involved in surf lifesaving outside the traditional summer Nippers season. It aligns closely with our strategic vision of strengthening community engagement and creating opportunities for local children to build confidence, develop surf awareness and enjoy everything our club has to offer.

The pilot program exceeded all expectations, filling quickly and generating a waitlist. Following its success, we delivered a second program in Term 1, welcoming 59 participants and once again reaching capacity with a waitlist. The smaller group sizes allowed for more individual attention and created a relaxed environment where participants developed surf safety knowledge, water confidence and teamwork, while families enjoyed connecting over a BBQ after each session.

The response from families has been overwhelmingly positive, reinforcing the value of providing a local, accessible program outside the busy summer period. We are excited to continue refining the program and building on its success in the years ahead.
